LENT COURSES

Anna's Corner

The following is from Wilderness Taunts - Revealing your Light by Ian Adams as a resource for prayer and refection throughout Lent. The book is introduced by Ian himself:

"To attempt to be a hopeful human being in the 21st century is a demanding thing. This book seeks to explore that task through series of 40 meditations with photographic images. It draws on the Gospel

accounts of the 40-day testing of Jesus in the wilderness. The temptations he faced there may be best understood as taunts seeking to throw him off balance. This book imagines what might be the taunts that we face now, whenever the light of our hope is confronted by the darkness in the world, and by the shadows within ourselves."

One of the taunts from this week was "You do not have what it takes You really do not.
You will fail.
And this a repeating pattern.
Others have what it takes. But you don't.
You are weak.
You do not have what it takes."

Sometimes we all feel like we're not getting it right, and it can be incredibly disheartening to feel like we're swimming against the tide and the things we are doing are not enough to make a difference. If you're feeling like that this week, I encourage you to absorb Ian's reflection:

"But how true is this?
Sure, you don't have all it takes.
But you have a little of what is needed.
Just a drop perhaps, but sometimes a trickle, a stream,
in time a river - and sometimes a great surge
into an ocean of strength and will.
From where does this come?
Deep in your being there is an at-oneness with the divine community who do have what it takes.
In the recognition that you lack everything
may come the understanding
that you lack nothing."
