A £30,000 funding bid has been sent off to the Foyle Foundation this week. Your prayers would be appreciated to support this, to be looked on favourably. Currently, we have raised over £100,000 towards the goal of £180,000 so this bid will move us on significantly towards this goal.

We have recently seen some greatly encouraging initiatives which have brought more people through our doors, such as Little Lambs, our Baby and Toddler Group which is attracting up to over 40 adults and children per week. Through their donations we have already been able to donate £100 to church funds. This is allowing us to develop new and deeper relationships with those in our community and to let them know that Lidgett is a place where they are welcomed, cared for and supported. The Community Café continues to be a place where people feel a real sense of belonging, we now have a team from City of York Council's Adult Social Care coming in to see people, and we will soon also be joined by Citizen's Advice Bureau, as well as our other regulars. Vocal Flourish and Friday Nourish continue to provide a safe and caring environment for people to find friendship and support.

The Greatest Commandment (Matthew 22:37-40): "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind". This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it "You shall love your neighbour as yourself". On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

The redevelopment work will allow us to welcome even more of our neighbours and show God's love to them as our space and facilities increase.
