It is the **100th Anniversary of Armistice Day this year**, and as you know, we want to mark this by decorating our large outside cross with **poppies** that we have been making in recent months. Not only do we want to remember all who have died, but we want to remind our community and ourselves of the cost of war so that we can commit to work and pray for Peace now and in the future.

The practicalities of this, are that **we need many more poppies** to give the covered cross as much impact as possible. We are hoping to site it nearer the church, away from the perimeter wall, so that the whole of the cross can be seen by passers by. It would be lovely if every single person in church could make at least one poppy (white for peace, if you would prefer) and for the whole of the cross to be well-covered. We can supply wool and instructions, and can help you make a start even if you have never knitted before. *Please see Helen if you would like some help.* **The deadline for bringing poppies to church is only a few weeks away, on Sunday 23rd September**, to allow enough time for the Craft and Chat members to assemble them onto the cross and install it well ahead of Remembrance Sunday. At the end of the year, we hope to make some wreaths from the poppies taken from the cross, to use in future years.
